2007 Monday After The Masters Tournament

Following a record breaking year in 2006, the Hootie and the Blowfish Monday After the Masters Charity Tournament returns to the Dye Club at Barefoot Resort on Monday, April 9, 2007. This year will be the 13th year of the tournament. The 2006 edition saw a record \$450,000 raised in charitable donations and the first sellout crowd in tournament history with more than 6,000 fans packing the Dye Club grounds. During its five-year residence in the Myrtle Beach area, the tournament has raised more than \$1,623,000 for the Hootie and the Blowfish Foundation, an organization dedicated to improving education in SC, the South Carolina Junior Golf Association, Special Olympics of SC, First Tee Program of Spartanburg, Junior Achievement of Coastal SC and Fairway Outreach. As is obvious from the above recipient organizations, the charity tournament puts emphasis on supporting golfing and educational opportunities for young people.

The tournament is set up as a Pro-Am featuring participation by Hootie Band members, PGA Tour Players, celebrity athletes and other celebrities. In 2006, legend Arnold Palmer made an appearance for the first time, perhaps one reason the crowd reached sellout capacity. In past years, John Daly, Tom Watson, Peter Jacobsen, Johnny Bench, Dan Marino, Fred Funk, Steve Spurrier, Jim McMahon and Samuel L. Jackson have participated. **see After The Masters Tourney - p. 3**

Brunswick First Tee Visits Barefoot and Bradley School

Approximately 60 young people from the First Tee Program of Brunswick County visited Barefoot Resort and Golf and the Nick Bradley Golf School on January 12 and 13. The kids were offered free clinics by Bradley and his staff instructors, Alasdair Dyer and Luanne Gilbert. Assistant Head Pro, Jeff Diehl, also helped with the instruction. Participants alternated between the long game and short game areas with each one getting some personal time with one of the Bradley School teachers. The clinics lasted four hours and the kids were given a gift bag with various golf items enclosed.

The First Tee is a World Golf Foundation initiative dedicated to providing young people of all backgrounds an opportunity to develop, through golf and character education, life-enhancing values such as honesty, integrity and sportsmanship. The intent is to offer opportunities for improvement in the quality of life and create a platform where children can increase their potential for success.

Plans are for 10 out of the approximately 60 participants to return to the Bradley School for more private instruction on a regular basis with Bradley and Dyer.

Built upon a 900-acre marsh preserve and carved out of a pristine forest, The Pearl East Golf Course is located on one of the most beautiful stretches of land on the Grand Strand. The scenery is spectacular especially when finishing up on the back nine as the fairways meander down to the Calabash River and marshes (seen in left photo). The wildlife, especially the bird population, is abundant and adds to the aesthetic experience of playing either of The Pearl's golf courses.

Dan Maples, one of the most celebrated coastal golf course designers, created both the Pearl East and West and several other courses in the immediate area including Oyster Bay Golf Links, Sandpiper Bay and the Maples Course at Sea Trail. Of the two Pearl layouts, the East Course is the most traditional with narrow tree-lined fairways, beautiful bunkering and typical coastal flora. The Pearl East was completely renovated in 1999. Both Pearl Courses have five sets of tees offering a fair golfing experience for all levels of golfer.

Making double bogey or worse means no points are awarded. Unlike normal golf competition where the lowest score wins, Stableford allows for the highest accumulation of points to win. The competition was very close with Kathy Horvat's 47 points edging out Terry Jee's 46 points. Jeanne Kenny came in third with 43 points while Linda Horak placed fourth with 40 points. Closest to the pin prizes were given to Linda Kunsman and Linda Painter. Phyllis Fessman was given the "Participation Award."

Ben Daigneault added a nice, unusual touch to get the ladies started in the right frame of mind. He placed three different types of chocolate on each of the golf carts used for the tournament. Following golf, Ben and Mike Ross welcomed the women to the Resort Restaurant for a mid-afternoon luncheon at which time the awards were presented. If the laughter coming from the restaurant during the luncheon and awards ceremony is any indication of the overall experience of the day, then a great time was had by all.
